SUMMARY

Performs manual work in the construction, installation, repair and maintenance of parks, roads, grounds, recreational areas, and buildings or facilities; operates a pickup truck with plow attachment and light equipment as assigned and does related work as required.

Ability to work in poor weather conditions, including heat, cold, rain, and snow. Sufficient stamina and good health to perform strenuous physical

labor. Ability to apply common sense understanding to carry out instructions furnished in written, oral, or diagrammatic form.

LANGUAGE SKILLS
