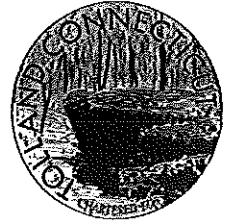

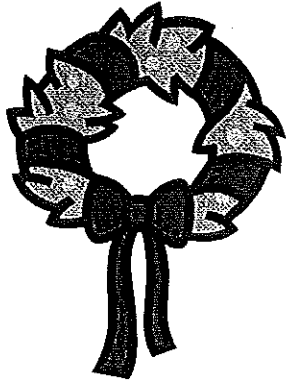

I've said many things about Tai Chi, but perhaps what you really need to know is how it can help you change your life.

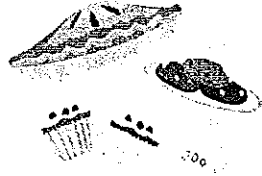



## Getting to Know You

Irene was born and raised in Troy, New York with a younger brother and sister. After graduation from high school she attended Nursing school at Good Samaritan Hospital in Troy, which is affiliated with Russell Sage College.

Irene has three children, two boys and a girl. A son lives in Tolland and one in Rome, New York. Her daughter is a nurse in North Carolina. There are ten grandchildren ranging in age from 13 through 28, one great grandchild, aged 2 and another on the way. After 19 years of marriage, Irene was divorced. Three years later she married and was widowed after eight years. She and Bill married in 2001 and they lead a very full and busy life.

This is an active gal with lots of interests and hobbies. I'm guessing that she's hardly ever idle. While raising her children she sewed their clothes. She enjoyed cooking for her family and still makes favorite recipes upon request such as bread pudding with lemon sauce and one son's favorite lasagna. Her interest in photography began with a Brownie camera, a favorite gift from her parents. Through the years her desire to get the word out to people about the importance of preserving photos and their family history turned to scrapbooking. She'd always been doing a form of scrapbooking by cataloging photos in albums but then she began to learn the many methods of embellishment of the photos and information that could be preserved. It turned to a business in which she is still very active.

A part of her past that few people may know is that at the age of five, she was sent to the Pawling Sanitorium in Pawling, New York for treatment of tuberculosis. She remained there for two and a half years, seeing her parents just every other week or so. The only treatment at the time was lots of sunshine and proper nutrition which, fortunately, was successful. Sadly, Irene's sister succumbed to the disease. At the Tolland Senior Center, Irene enjoys Wii bowling and the twice weekly luncheons. She counsels women at cardiac health risk and she and Bill teach the AARP safe driving course.

She enjoys reading mysteries and fiction based on history. She has a great love of travel and has been throughout Europe and to Alaska (and of course, went on the helicopter ride!), Hawaii, New Mexico, St. Thomas and always looks forward to family reunions in Kentucky. She has always loved music and singing and sang in high school plays. I also learned that she was a very good jitter bugger and I'll bet she can still cut a rug.

If you don't already know Irene, look for her picture on the bulletin board at the Senior Center and seek her out and introduce yourself. You'll be glad you did. I know I am.

Tolland residents who are at least 60 years of age or disabled adults under 60 are qualified for the Dial-a-Ride service. Transportation is provided between 8:30 a.m.–4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday excluding holidays. Dial-a-Ride travels to all locations in Vernon, Ellington and Tolland including medical appointments, shopping, social and recreational. Whenever possible grocery and other shopping trips are provided on a group basis.

In order to continue to provide reliable safe transportation to the Tri Town area, a \$1.00 donation will be needed when boarding the van on each trip. Round trip costs \$2.00. You must have the exact amount as the drivers will not have change. To make reservations, call 860-870-7940 between 8:30 a.m.–2:00 p.m. Reservations for medical appointments are taken up to 28 days in advance. All other reservations are taken up to 14 days in advance.
