Tolland Public Library

3-D Printing

The Tolland Public Library offers Tolland residents an opportunity to learn, create and collaborate using a 3-D printer.

The Tolland Public Library's 3-D printer may be used for lawful purposes only. Patrons will not be permitted to use the printer in the creation of material that is

- Prohibited by local, state or federal law.
- Unsafe, harmful, dangerous or poses an immediate threat to the wellbeing of others.
- Obscene or otherwise inappropriate for the library environment.
- In violation of another's intellectual property rights. For example the printer will not be used to reproduce material subject to copyright, patent or trademark protection.

The library reserves the right to refuse any 3-D print request.

The library does not guarantee a successful print. Unless the print fails to finish, the cost of the completed print, regardless of quality, will still be charged.

The library will charge \$.10 a gram of plastic.

Users most have a valid Tolland Public Library card.

Maximum use is two hours. Reservations may be made up to one week in advance. The 3-D printer will be turned off 30 minutes before closing.

Patrons wishing to use the 3-D printer need to be trained by library staff or volunteers. Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by and supervised by an adult.

The library is not responsible for the subsequent safety of any item made with the 3-D printer.
